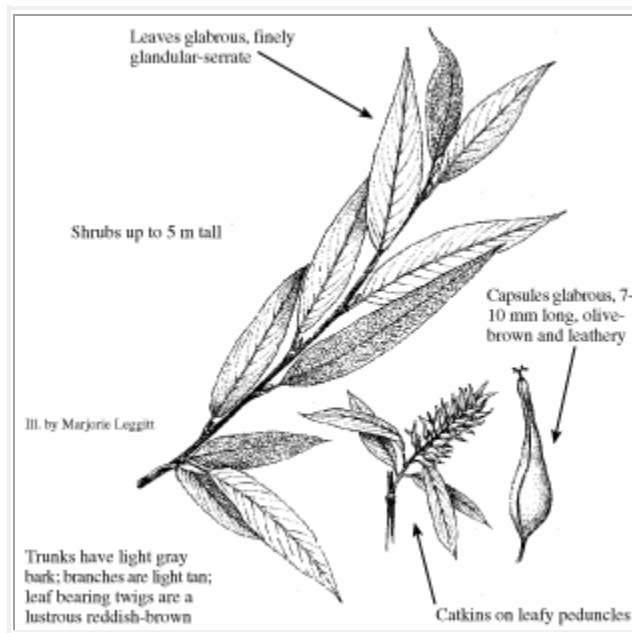

Salicaceae (Willow Family)

Look Alikes: *S. lucida* ssp. *caudata* and *S. lucida* ssp. *lasiandra* have shining, long, acuminate leaves; shorter capsules (less than 7 mm long); and catkins that mature earlier in the summer.

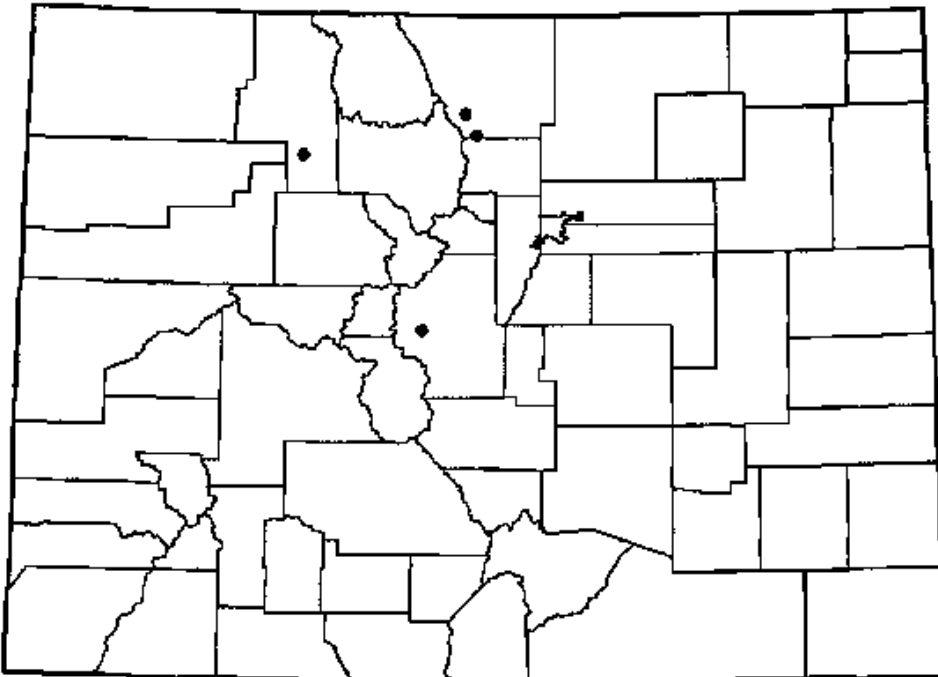
Flowering/Fruiting Period: May-July/catkins mature late July-early September, later than most other willow species.

Habitat: Marshes or fens with other *Salix* and *Carex* species. Elev. 7800- 9300 ft.
