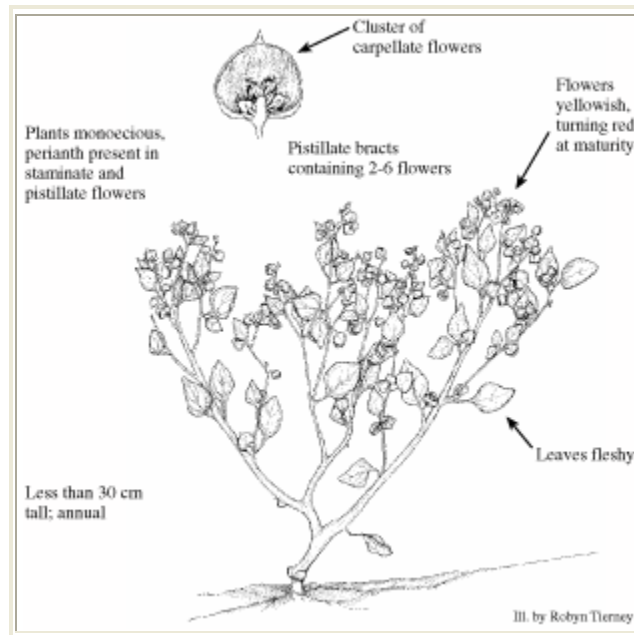

Chenopodiaceae (Goosefoot Family)

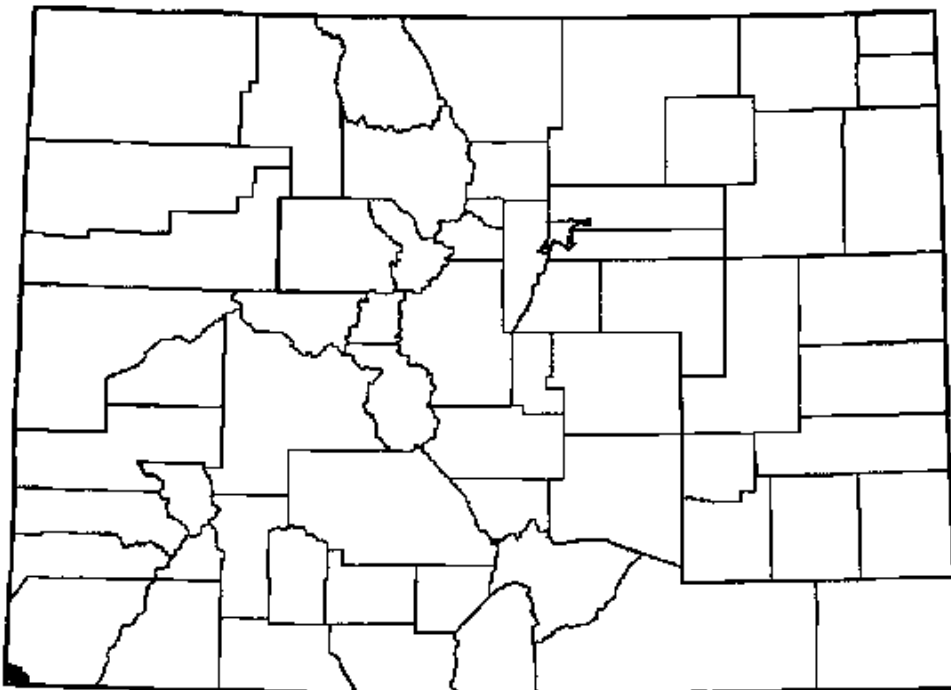
Synonym: *Atriplex pleiantha*

Look Alikes: Distinguished by its low, annual habit, fleshy leaves, and in having male and female flowers on the same plant.

Flowering/Fruiting Period: Flowers late May-June.

Habitat: Barren, saltbrush badlands; on highly dissected and eroded gray shale and clay of the Mancos Formation. Elev. 4800-5000 ft.

Distribution: NW New Mexico, SE Utah and SW Colorado (Montezuma Co.).
