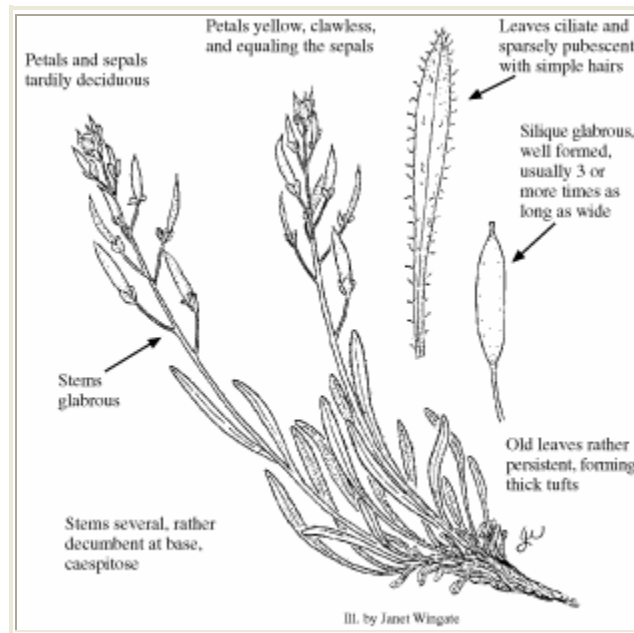

Brassicaceae (Mustard Family)

Look Alikes: *D. grayana* has dense tangled simple pubescence on the stems and clawed petals. *D. crassifolia* has much shorter styles (less than 0.15 mm). *D. crassa* has a sparsely pubescent stem and usually has four or more stem leaves.

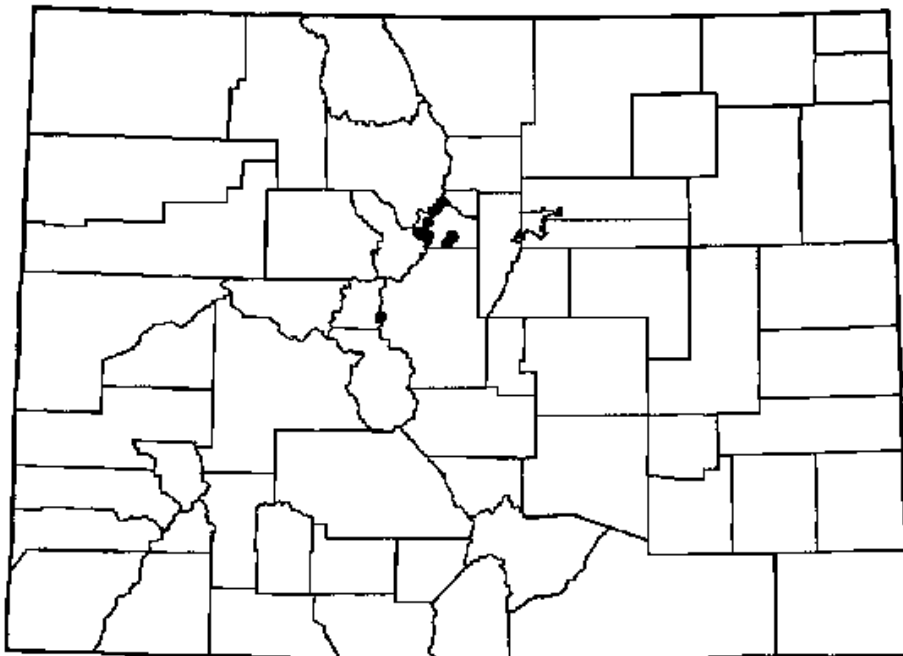
Flowering/Fruiting Period: Late June-July/early August.

Habitat: Rocky, gravelly slopes and talus; fellfields; usually granitic bedrock.
Elev. 12,000-14,000 ft.
